Examples of George's expertise include:

- Acting for a global interior fit-out contractor in connection with claims brought against it involving allegations of defective workmanship and design;
- Assisting with an adjudication for the main contractor in relation to its dispute with an energy provider concerning the construction and installation of a major gas pipeline;
- Acting for a private school in connection with the successful defence of a "smash and grab" adjudication brought by a large UK contractor in connection with major building and refurbishment works at the school;
